Vikas Jangra and Aishwarya Bhattacharya proved they were a cut above the rest as they lived up their top game of squash to win the men's and women's singles titles, defeating Jindal Squash Academy's Laxman Joshi and Urvashi Joshi respectively in the Rs 1 lakh prize money of 4th Braveheart Ashok Kamte Squash Classic 2012, played at the Bombay Gymkhana Squash Courts. Vikas Jangra, in very good touch throughout the tournament, ended the game before showing tremendous reserves of stamina, combined with a fine combination of shots to win the final against Laxman Joshi, winning the men's final in straight games, the scoreline reading 11-5, 11-8, 15-13 to bag the winner's purse of Rs 8,000.

The women's open final was very exciting and upset win for Aishwarya. The young Aishwarya started the match very well, and won the first set 11-6. But defending champion Urvashi came back

very strongly and won the second set 11-6. But Aishwarya came back in the game after winning the third set 11-8, but Urvashi put her experienced in the fourth game and win the set 11-8. After winning the two sets both the players started the fifth and decider set in a great fashion. After the 11-11 tie break, Urvashi's errors helped Aishwarya to win the set and final 11-6, 6-11, 11-8, 8-11, 13-11. Aishwarya took home a purse of Rs 7,000/-.

Another talented youngster, Aishwarya Singh won a double, winning the Boys U-17 title and then pairing with Puneet Parekh to win the Handicap Doubles title. In the U-17 final Aishwarya Singh beat Akhilesh Yadav in five games at 11-13, 11-8, 11-7, 8-11, 11-7, while in the Doubles Handicap final with Puneet Parekh, they defeated Vishal Yadav and Nilesh Pal 15-11, 11-15, 15-12. Aishwarya received a cash award of Rs.5,000/- for his under-17 win and Rs 8,000 for the handicap doubles title.

## 37th Maharashtra State Open Senior Squash Championship 2012

**T**op seeds Saurav Ghosal and Joshana Chinappa lived up to their reputations and emerged supreme in the 37th Bombay Gymkhana Maharashtra State Open Senior Squash Championship.

India No. 1 Ghosal overcame defending champion and second seed Siddharth Suchde 11-4, 11-9, 13-11 in a high quality Men's Open final that lasted 53 minutes, while Chinappa rallied from the loss of the opening set to prevail over second seed and last year's runner-up Urvashi Joshi of Jindal Squash Academy 6-11, 11-6, 11-3, 11-3 in the women's championship.

Ghosal and Suchde treated the packed gallery to long and aggressive rallies with both giving little away. Ghosal dominated the opening set but faced stiff resistance from a determined Suchde in the second and third.

After losing the second set narrowly, while coming back from 7-10 down, India No. 2 Suchde made a brave bid to stay alive in the contest with another gallant effort in the third when he trailed 8-10. He smacked crucial boasts both on the forehand

and backhand that led him to draw level at 10-all and 11-all before he hit the tin that ended his brilliant challenge.

"I played a solid first set but Sid raised his level in the second and third sets," explained Ghosal who has never lost to Suchde. "But I had to make the right choice of shots and that I think proved crucial. He could have played better. He has a good basic game, while I rely on speed and shot-making."

**M**ahesh Mangaonkar of Maharashtra and Anaka Alankamony of Tamil Nadu fashioned impressive victories to help themselves in the Junior & Sub Junior National Championship at the Cricket Club of India.

Playing his last season before he steps into the senior ranks, Mangaonkar beat Deepak Mishra of Tamil Nadu in straight sets to complete a rewarding domestic run, following triumphs in the Maharashtra State Open and Little Masters tournaments.

Top seed in the women's and under-19 categories, Alankamony lived up to her reputation, winning in straight sets over the same opponent, compatriot Aparajitha Balamurukan.

While Mangaonkar and Alankamony won their titles with relative ease, it was the sub juniors who took away the championship honours with heart-stopping performances.

After winning the under-11 national crown two seasons ago, top seed Chaitanya Shah of Bombay Gymkhana overcame the redoubtable Veer Chotrani of Khar Gymkhana in a pulsating five-setter, after trailing 1-2, in the boys under-13 final. This was Shah's fourth title in a row following triumphs in the India Junior Open, Maharashtra State Open and Little Masters.

Seeded third/fourth, S. Navaneeth Prabhu of Tamil Nadu shocked top seed and favourite Yash Fadte of Goa 4-11, 11-6, 6-11, 11-9, 11-9 in another nail-biting encounter for the boys' under-11 crown. Fadte frittered away a 2-1 lead and a 9-8 advantage in the decider.

Among the girls, Jui Kalgutkar and Nikita Joshi of Maharashtra scalped their maiden national titles. Under-15 second seed Kalgutkar upset top seed Adya Advani of Delhi in straight sets to avenge her defeat in the Maharashtra State Open semi-finals.

Top seed Joshi of Otters Club beat talented Diya Joukani of Khar Gymkhana in straight sets for the under-13 crown.

**B**oy's under-11 top seed Yash Fadte of Goa and under-9 second seed Jeh Pandole of Mumbai avenged recent defeats against arch-rivals to emerge champions in The Little Masters Junior Squash Tournament, an SRFI 3-Star ranking event, organized and hosted by The Willingdon Sports Club, Mumbai.

CCI Iad Pandole, who lost to Khar Gymkhana's Jay Vaknalli in straight sets at the recently concluded Maharashtra State Junior Open at Bombay Gymkhana, upset the top seed 11-7, 12-10, 11-8 in a tight championship round. Favourite Vaknalli battled hard to keep his hopes alive and ran Pandole close in all sets.

Last year's runner-up Fadte overcame second seed Advait Adik of Otters Club, Mumbai 11-7, 12-10, 6-11, 11-2 in an exciting championship round to avenge his defeat at the Maharashtra State Open where he lost to Adik in the final after leading 5-0 and reaching match point at 10-7 in the decider.

"It was brutally hard and excruciatingly long. I'm totally dead. This was definitely number one match for me," the exhausted Mahesh said after the match.

In the semi finals Mahesh managed to end top seed Julien Balbo's spree and to take aback the Frenchman's fans. "I did not expect this. I mean, the Indian is half his age and Julien looked so confident. I am dismayed," one of them said.

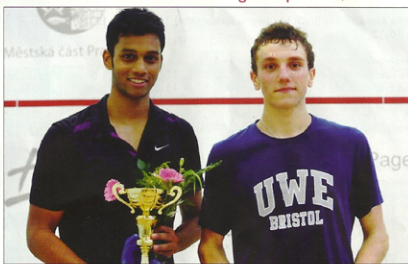

**Alankamony stuns Lindsay to win title**

(21/10/2012)

**I**ndia's Anaka Alankamony claimed her second title on the women's professional squash tour when she stunned top seed Kylie Lindsay of New Zealand to win the Ipswich Open in Queensland, Australia.

The 18-year-old from Chennai took advantage of a string of errors from the world number 39 to win in straight games 11-8, 13-11, 11-5 in hot and humid conditions.

Alankamony had earlier beaten sixth seeded South African Cheyna Tucker in the semi-finals and fourth ranked Christine Nunn in the quarters to complete a weekend of upsets.

She settled far quicker than Lindsay in the final and took control in all three games to record a comfortable win.

"It's been an amazing week for me, I was seventh seed for this tournament so it feels really good to win," she said.

"I train in Chennai and it's very humid there and I think it was a big advantage for me because it is a similar climate to over there," she said.

"The climate didn't really affect me – I really enjoyed playing here."

**J**oshna Chinappa claims the IJM Land Penang Open after defeating top seed Siti Munirah Jusoh to deny Malaysian hopes of a home title win.

The top two seeds battled it out at the Nicol David International Squash Centre, having both dropped just one game en route the final. Chinnappa gained a walkover in her first round tie after Pakistani qualifier Zahab Khan withdrew injured. The Indian later battled from a game down against No.6 seed Karman Siu to face another Hong Kong international in No.3 seed Carmen Lee.

Jusoh made short work of her first round clash against compatriot Teh Min Jie, before facing a second fellow-Malaysian Rachel Arnold whom she also dispatched in three games. Tong Tsz-Wing proved a tougher challenge in the semi-finals, and the top seed needed an hour to defeat the Hong Kong international.

It was the Indian who kept up her dominant form in the final however, winning a narrow first game. Jusoh's resilience waned as the match progressed, and the gap in the score was more pronounced in the second game. Unable to match the pace, the Malaysian succumbed to defeat claiming just one point from the third game, allowing Chinnappa to claim her seventh WSA World Tour title.

**Seeded 10 India finishes their best ever: 5th place in the world as Egypt snatch Women's World Team Title**

In a dramatic final of the WSF Women's World Team Championship in Nîmes which went to the wire, second seeds Egypt recovered from a match down to upset favourites England to win the World Squash Federation event being held in France for the first time.

Boasting a record entry of 26 nations, the 2012 championship has been staged at both the eight-court Club des Costières and La Parnasse Arena where, for the first time ever, action has taken place simultaneously on three all-glass show courts.

The championship came to a magnificent conclusion for India when the tenth seeds beat Ireland, the No7 seeds, to win fifth place. It was the teams' second meeting in five days. Joshana Chinappa put India in the driving seat by beating Aisling Blake - but 13-time Irish champion Madeline Perry levelled matters by gaining a revenge win over Indian number one Dipika Pallikal.

It was down to teenager Anaka Alankamony to clinch victory for India when the 18-year-old from Chennai defeated experienced Laura Mylotte 11-8, 11-7, 11-8 in the decider.

"It's been an amazing week - and this is so good for India," said Alankamony. "I played her before on the club courts and beat her - but I like playing on glass so I was confident of beating her again. I think this was a big advantage - but my team is a big advantage too!"

## PROSQUASH speaks to Krish Kapur upcoming squash player from Kolkata



**Krish Kapur**

**K**rish Kapur is an Under-15 category squash player from Kolkata, who has made spectacular progress, reaching the Semi Final of the Junior National Championship in November 2012. Here is an interview with Krish.

**Prosquash- With your amazing climb in a short span of time, squash enthusiast would like to know more about you! What is your background- your school, where you play, how you took**

**up squash, your progress from beginning till now?**

**Krish-** I am 14 years of age, studying in class 8 at Calcutta International School. I started playing squash at the age of 6 through one of Dad's friends, Ramon Tandon (Rishi and Ramits' Dad) at The Calcutta Rackets Club. I was reluctant to play but when I first tried, I loved it. Gautam Sir was my first ever coach. He was an excellent coach and helped develop my interest in the game.

After about a year my family shifted to Myanmar and I stopped playing squash for about 3 years. When we shifted back I was forcefully put back in squash by my Dad! Surprisingly in less than 5 months I caught Dalip Tripathi- my present coach's attention. I was excelling in the Junior Development Program so he put me in the State Development Program.

**Prosquash- Please elaborate on your meteoric rise in tournaments, and performance at the Nationals. Do tell us about your training regime!**

**Krish-** The first tournaments I started playing were in West Bengal itself. I won every tournament in my age category. My first tournament outside West Bengal was the 2010 Nationals. I lost in the second round! For the next year I didn't make it past the 3rd round in a single tournament. My results in Nationals were very bad. My luck changed though in the Indian Juniors. Being

unseeded in the U-15 category I managed to overcome 2 seeds and make it into the semis. For the next two months I trained rigorously for the upcoming nationals. The training paid off. Being a qualifier I managed to upset the 3/4th seed and a 5/8th seed to make it in the second semifinal in a row.

From Monday to Friday I would train for an hour followed by pushups, sit-ups and lots of stretching. On Saturdays I would go for long runs in the morning and match practice in the evening. I enjoyed it thoroughly. Sundays were a day off from training.

**Prosquash- How do your school and family encourage you?**

**Krish-** My school has been very supportive. They help me a lot in my studies when I miss out on school because of tournaments. I am not a very bright student in my studies compared to others and coping up with school work would have been very difficult for me if it wasn't for my teachers.

My family has been supportive from the start. They always encourage me to train and play hard. They always come to watch all my matches. Without them it would have been impossible to get this far.

**Prosquash- What is your ambition in squash?**

**Krish-** I am not really sure what my future ambitions for squash might be but for right now I want to keep on training hard and represent India in the Asian Juniors.

**Prosquash- Do you have any favorite player/s?**

**Krish-** When I started playing, I used to look up to Vivek Dinodia- another player from Bengal. I loved his game and wanted to play just like him. He in turn helped me out in areas in my game which were weak. Some of my favorite PSA players are Ramy Ashour, Amr Shabana, and Sourav Ghosal.

**Prosquash- Do you have interests other than squash? If there is anything you'd like to share, please do.**

**Krish-** I have lots of interests actually. I just love food! Cooking and eating! I love reading books and listening to songs. Apart from squash I enjoy playing all kinds of sports such as football, cricket, basketball, table tennis etc.
