Mumbai University retain title beating Delhi University

Defending champions Mumbai University overcame former champions Delhi to retain the title, in the All India Inter-University Squash Championship, organized by H.R. College Sports Council, at the Bombay Gymkhana.

Puneet Pareek gave Mumbai the perfect start with a 3-1 win over Anshul before Ashray Ohri pulled one back for Delhi by winning the second tie, in the best-of-five championship round against Waqar Pathan.

But Mumbai earned victory the hard way when their star player Shashi Pandey was stretched all the way into the decider in a gruelling encounter before he overcame a gallant Utkarsh Kumar 11-9, 11-6, 10-12, 12-14, 14-12 in a pulsating third tie.

Tushar Kothari sealed victory in the crucial fourth but not before earning a hard-fought 11-6, 11-8, 11-13, 7-11, 11-4 win over Harshid Muchal that also stretched into the decider after he enjoyed a comfortable 2-0 advantage.

Last year's runners-up Punjab University who were shocked in the semi-finals by Delhi, settled for third place with a 3-1 win over Pune University

Second seeds Yohan Pandole and Arman Darukhanawala upset the top seeds to clinch the boys' under-19 and under-11 titles, respectively, in the Matunga Gymkhana Junior Open Squash Tournament in Mumbai

PSA World Tour Challenger 5 IMET Open 2013

Mahesh Mangaokar is 1st Indian IMET open winner in Slovakia (15/12/2013)

Five-game victories over the event's top two seeds led to Mahesh Mangaonkar becoming the first Indian winner of the PSA IMET Open, the PSA World Tour Challenger 5 squash event marking its sixth year at the Imet Squash Centrum in the Slovakia capital Bratislava.

The 19-year-old World No.98 from Mumbai made his breakthrough in the semi-finals where he downed two-time champion Jan Koukal, the top seed from the Czech Republic expected to make his fourth final appearance in six years, 13-11, 11-8,9-11,7-11,13-11 in 98 minutes.

Third seed Mangaonkar then lined up against defending champion Greg Lobban, the No.2 seed from Scotland who was celebrating his third successive appearance in a Tour final.

Despite his heroics less than 24 hours earlier, the Indian teenager was still able to call upon reserves to recover from losing the first game to take a 2/1 lead. Edinburgh-based Lobban, ranked 82 in the world, dug deep to take the fourth to force a fifth game decider. But Mangaonkar refused to give up, reclaiming the advantage to close out the match 7-11, 11-8, 11-4, 6-11, 11-7 after 77 minutes to take the title.

PSA Challenger 5 Open du Gard

Mahesh 3rd PSA title in Nimes,

France (06/01/2014)

India's sensational teenager Mahesh Mangaonkar began the New Year with the first title of the year when he despatched top-seeded Scot Greg Lobban in the final of the Open du Gard, the PSA Challenger 5 squash event marking its sixth year at Squash des Arenes in Nimes, France.

Third seed Mangaonkar made his breakthrough in the semi-finals when he crushed second-seeded Kuwaiti Ammar Altamimi in just 28 minutes, Now in the fourth Tour final of his career, the 19-year-old from Mumbai had a point to prove when he faced Lobban, a 21-year-old from Edinburgh enjoying his eighth Tour final.

Mangaonkar's success in last month's Imet Open in Slovakia came after a five-game final victory over Lobban - the result of which is that both now players share a World No.82 ranking.

The win, his third on the PSA Tour, also set up a nine-match winning streak for the Mumbai teenager - the longest of his career.

Joshana Chinappa picks her eighth WSA World Tour title at Detoit, USA (28/01/2014)

Joshana Chinappa picked up the eighth WSA World Tour title of her career when she outlasted Egypt's Heba El Torky in the final of the Winnipeg Winter Club Women's Open, the WSA Tour 15 squash event in its fifth year at the Winnipeg Winter Club in Winnipeg, Canada.

Chinappa squandered a game ball in the first game to let El Torky take the opener - but struck back in the next two games to take back the lead.

World No20 Chinappa saw El Torky draw level after winning the fourth by a significant margin - then soon found herself three match balls down at 7-10 in the decider.

However, the momentum shifted again to Chinappa as the determined Chennaiborn 27-year-old ran off five points in a row to clinch the match 12-14, 11-8, 11-5, 3-11, 12-10.

The success marks the second successive Indian winner of the title after Dipika Pallikal's triumph in 2013.

"Congratulations to both Joshna and Heba for a great tournament here in Winnipeg and to all the girls for putting on a great show here in Winnipeg at the Winnipeg Winter Club Women's Open," said tournament promoter Trevor Borland.

In the prequarter final, he defeated his nemesis Mohd Zafri (Malaysia)- Asia No-1

in Under-13 last year, who Tushar had lost to in earlier tournaments. In the quarter final, Tushar lost in a five setter to 2nd seed Asher Hisham (Egypt), and lost again in 5 sets in 5/6 position match to Mustafa Elserty (Egypt).

Despite hampered training throughout last year due to a nagging knee condition associated with growth spurt, Tushar has finished at the highest position this year at the British Junior from among players from Maharsahtra, also taking Khar Gymkhana Squash Academy to unprecedented heights. Tushar subsequently won the Scottish Junior title at Edenburg which was held between 7th to 9th January 2014 making his first International title.

Prosquash speaks to Adwiteya Kasliwal upcoming squash player

Adwiteya Kasliwal is a squash player from Daly College, Indore. She rose to prominence when last year she finished at the top position at the Indian team selection for the Asian Junior Championships at Jordan. Here is an interview with her.

Prosquash-Please tell us about your school and squash!

Adwiteya- I'm studying in Daly College Indore, 8th standard. Playing squash is my passion. I'm a sports person and participate in hockey, basket ball and swimming as well. In academics too I perform well and I'm the topper of my class. Maths is my favorite subject. My parents always support me. Squash has helped me build my focus.

Prosquash-Tell us about how you took up Squash?

Adwiteya- Squash always fascinated me. I used to see my brother playing which inspired me too. I started playing when I was 7 years old. My mom used to take me along with my brother in morning 6am everyday to the courts.

Prosquash- How do you train? How do you balance training with studies?

Adwiteya - I go to train 6 to 8 in morning (in school) and attend my school till 4 and train again from 4 to 6 in school itself. Then in the evening I have my tuitions and study till 9. This is how I balance both!

Prosquash- Are your family members also interested in sports, or have a background in sports? How do they encourage you to play squash?

Adwiteya- I don't have a family background in sports. My brother had only inspired me to play but my family always encourages me to play and support me. My mentor Mr. Gajendra Singh also motivated me to play.

Prosquash-What are your latest achievements in squash, as well as other sports and co curricular activities?

Adwiteya- My latest achievement was being selected for the Indian team and stood first in U-13. I represented India in Jordan. Other than this I stood 4th in Indian open

Prosquash- What are your other interests apart from Squash?

in Chennai in 2012.

Adwiteya- I love reading books, listening to music and photography. I play hockey, football, swimming, basketball as well.

Prosquash-What is your ambition? Adwiteya- I want to further represent India and I'm training hard for it. My ambition is to become a civil lawyer.

Cases against Ramachandran may put IOA in big trouble

Some serious case of alleged misleading, forgery and manipulation are coming up against Indian Association of India president elect N Ramachandran (brother of BCCI president N Srinivasan) that may put his position untenable and may put IOA into a fix thereby threatening a further ban on India's Olympic movement by IOC

As many as 3 cases, one already in the Delhi High Court and two more cases (not Court cases as yet) are coming up against Ramachandran very shortly.

While the first case is of allegedly misleading the Indian government to get a National Award in 2011 and is coming up for hearing in Delhi High Court on February 21.

The PIL against him in this case says N Ramchandran misled the Indian government in getting Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Purashkar (RKPP) in 2011 by the President of India. It alleges that he had misled the Sports Ministry by not fulfilling any of the 16 clauses needed to get the award. The PIL is aimed at revocation of the award.

Second case -- that of alleged Conflict of Interest

-- may put him in clear trouble and also the IOA if elected unopposed as president on Feb 9th. This case is likely to come up once he is elected the IOA President.

In this case of conflict of interest, Ramachandran has violated the International Olympic Committee's Code of Ethics. Ramachandran had given an undertaking to World Squash Federation in 2012 that he had no commercial interest in the game and designated himself just as patron of Squash and Racquet Federation of India while in reality, he was at that time and even now, the president of the SRFI.

He also did not mention that he was/is the president of Tamil Nadu Squash & Racquet Federation of India. Most importantly, the IOC code of conduct prohibits any candidate to contest election if he has any conflict of interest in the conduct of the federation or association.

Though Ramachandran had mentioned that he has no financial interest in the game of squash, the agreement (documents of which are in possession of Headlines Today) between Tamil Nadu Rackets Association and Sports Development Authority of Tamil Nadu dated

April 22, 2002; says in point 7 (iii) The TNSRA shall be free to initiate steps to ensure commercial viability, fixation of membership, one time charges etc without compromising intent and purpose of this arrangement.

The third case pertains to case of alleged forgery with documents that prohibited Deepkia Pallikal from contesting a tournament. The case may come up again in Delhi High Court.

Ramachandran had told Headlines Today that the case had been dismissed by the High Court earlier but new and fresh facts have emerged in this case.

SRFI misguided the Sports Ministry with alleged forged documents before the Delhi High Court and subsequently in Supreme Court in 2008 to keep top squash player Deepika Pallikal out of the contingent list due to their personal dislikes for her.

Headlines Today has a copy of the original document of Long Term Development Plan (LTDP) under CWG dated February 2008 sent by the SRFI to the Sports Ministry and also the forged documents dated May 2008 which suddenly had the rules and regulations which didn't allow Pallikal to compete.

A natural athlete, Dipika Pallikal took a liking to squash at the age of nine after which there was no looking back for this girl from Chennai. Determined to make it big with support from her mother Susan, she left the comforts of her home at the age of 14 to train in Egypt under world renowned coach Amir Wagh.

2008

Winner in British Junior Open.

2009

Dipika excelled under his guidance and in a matter of four years went on to win nine open titles and several other national tournaments thereby firmly establishing herself in the junior circuit. It was only a matter of time before she became the number 1 player in the under 19 category and received a nomination for the "Young Player of the Year" award at the World Squash Awards, 2009 for her exceptional achievements.

2010

Dipika didn't lose her excellent touch as she moved on to the senior circuit and walked away with the WISPA Indian Challenger No. 5 and the Nepal Open titles in 2010. The same year, she was also a part of the women's team which secured a bronze medal at the Asian Games. She became the 1st Indian to reach World No.1 in Junior Under – 19 Rankings.

2011

2011 was the a great year for this young squash player when she claimed three prestigious WISPA titles – Orange County Open (California), Dread Sports Series Tournament (Washington) and Crocodile Challenge Cup (Hong Kong) and

advanced into the top 20 in world rankings. She was also the 1st Indian to reach Quarter Finals in a World Open Championship – 2011.

In recognition of her efforts, she was awarded the L'Oreal Femina Best Sportsperson and the NDTV 24/7 Rockstar best sportswoman awards of 2011-2012 (Arjuna Award)

2012

SHE scaled new heights in the year 2012 and reached the finals of the Tournament of Champions New York (Silver event) and the semi finals of the Australian Open (Gold event), becoming the only Indian to achieve such remarkable feats.

She later helped India clinch a gold medal and its maiden women's title at the Senior Asian Team Squash Tournament held in Kuwait in May 2012. She also became the 1st Indian to reach top-10 in the World in 2012.

However, the crowning glory for Dipika came when the Indian Government acknowledging her consistent string of remarkable performances,

presented her with the Arjuna Award the 1st player to get it at the young age of 20.

2013

In 2013, she displayed great tenacity in the Meadowood Pharmacy Open (Canada) to set up a final against the second seeded Joey Chan and won the contest in straight games taking her total WSA title's tally to six. Currently training under her coach Sarah Fitz-Gerald (former world number squash player) Dipika aspires to carve a formidable image for India in the international arena by becoming the number 1 squash player in the world.

2014 (Padma Shri Award)
